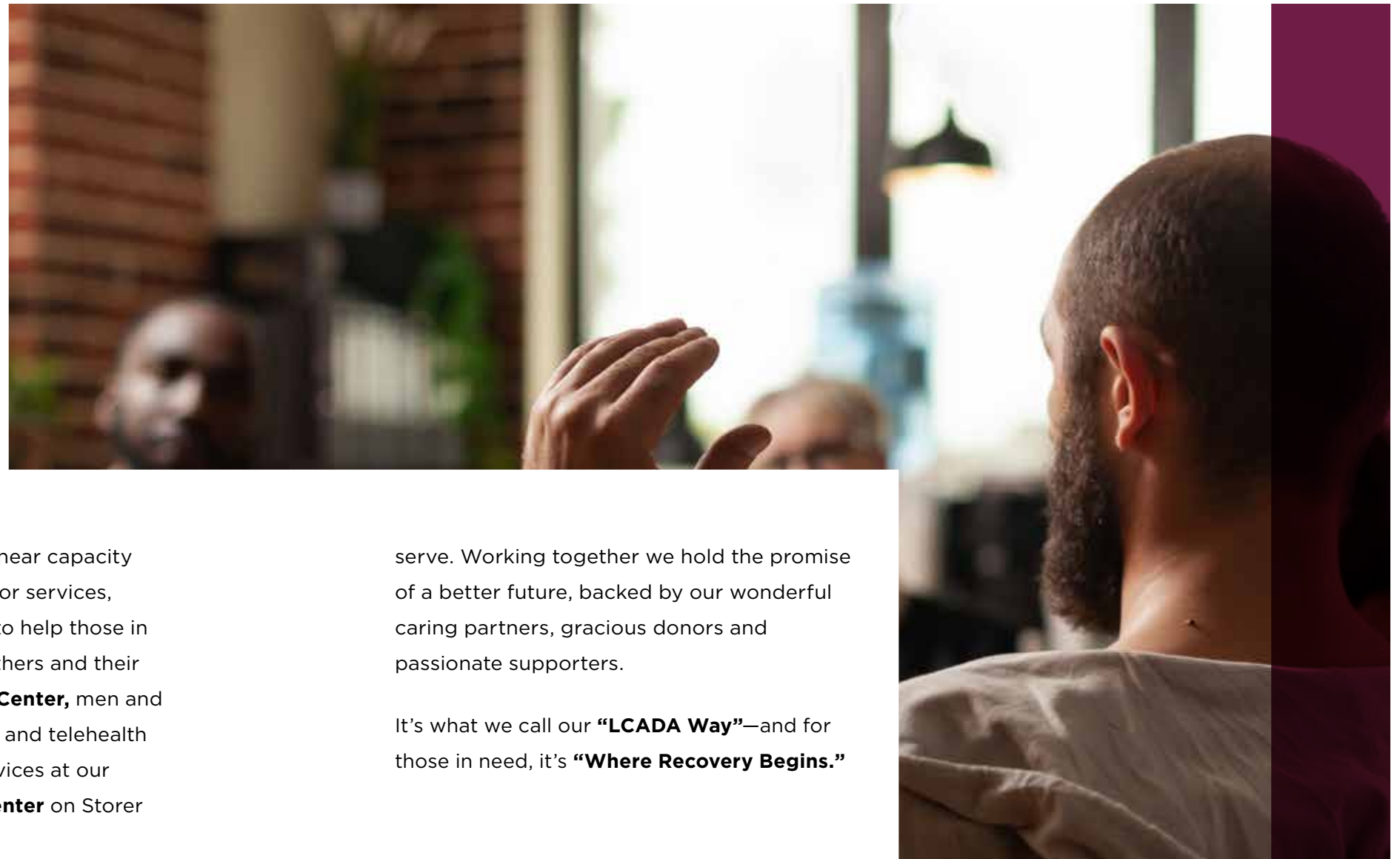
Our approach works, because of our dedicated staff filled with experience, programs and outcome focused services passionately delivered at each of our centers in the communities we

Ways to Give

REAL ESTATE

Real Estate such as personal residences, farms, vacation homes, commercial and rental property is often the subject of gifts. Like gifts of appreciated securities, gifts of real estate can be attractive because of the double tax benefit—an immediate charitable contribution and the avoidance of capital gains tax.

GIFTS-IN-KIND

Gifts-in-Kind are goods and services whose worth cannot necessarily be counted in dollars, but provide an added benefit to the organization. This includes supporting our fleet of vans with oil, gas and maintenance. We are one of the first organizations in the country to provide treatment transportation to our customers.
